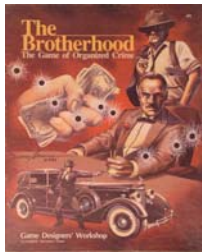
Spiel der Spiele

Anniversary Gaming

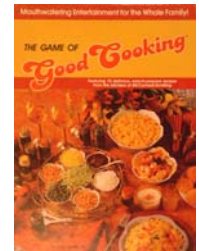


Atypically October 15th is not the anniversary of many events that can be commemorated by games, but there are still several. Novelist Mario Puzo's most famous book *The Godfather* inspired the like titled *The Godfather Game* (Family Games) as well as *The Brotherhood* (Conflict / GDW). The game about the trial of the German war criminals is *Nuremberg: Trial of the Century* (Minden/*Panzerschreck*#2). Curiously October 15th 1959 was the birthday of two food industry superstars: chef Emeril Lagasse and weight-watcher Sarah Ferguson. Many games about food exist, such as *The Game of Good Cooking* (Victory).

- 1991 Clarence Thomas confirmed as an Associate Justice of the Supreme Court

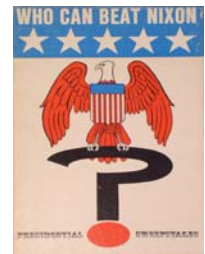


November 5th is the anniversary of Guy Fawkes' "Gunpowder Plot" to blow up the English Parliament. The plot was thwarted when conspirator Francis Tresham warned his brother-in-law, a Member of Parliament, not to attend the next days' session. Interestingly "Francis Tresham" is also the name of the famous game designer of *1829* and *Civilization*. A game about the conspiracy exists: *Gunpowder Treason* (Aztral Games), which was designed by an existing game company as a promotional item for a fireworks manufacturer!

Although there are only seven possible dates for a U.S. Presidential election to be held, curiously both elections where someone ran for a third term occurred on November 5th, (and both candidates shared the same last name). *All Quiet on the Western Front* is not only the title of the third movie to win a Best Picture Academy Award, but a game (Critical Hit). On November 5th 1968 Richard Nixon won a three-way race for president. His reelection campaign would inspire the games *Who Can Beat Nixon?* (Harrison-Blaine of New Jersey), *Watergate* (Politico), *Watergate* (Beck Designs) and *The Watergate Scandal* (American Symbolic Corporation). On this date in 1935 Parker Brothers released *Monopoly*. In 1999 the federal government celebrated its 64th birthday by declaring Microsoft Corporation an illegal monopoly.

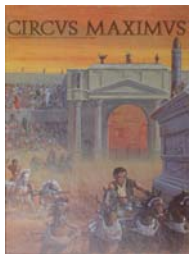
November 5th

The Games We Played

This month the most played games were *Age of Steam 2: Western U.S.*, *Empire of the Sun*, *Ingenious*, *Taj Mahal*, *That's Life*, *Triumph of Chaos* and *Tutankhamen*.



Curiously a variety of games from the 1960s and 70s were played at EPGS for the first time in the five years of our database: *Circus Maximus*, *Napoleon*, *Paydirt* and *Victory in the Pacific*. Furthermore remakes of two 1980s games were also introduced: *Arkham Horror* and *Conquest of the Empire*.

It also is ironic that the games *Napoleon* and *Wellington* were both played for the first time this month, as well as *La Guerre de L'Empereur*.
